Food waste audit

Thanks for participating in the first-ever LifeSmarts food waste audit. Ali Schklair from the National Consumers League shared these results:

- We fed 225 people Saturday night, and had 48 pounds post-consumer food waste:
 - o 19 pounds liquid waste
 - 13 pounds fruits and vegetables
 - o 16 pounds protein and grains
 - >1 pound trash
- Food that the kitchen disposed of (that was never served) included 42 pounds:
 - o 26 pounds fruits and vegetables
 - o 16 pounds proteins and grains
- Key take-aways:
 - By composting food waste, we diverted 90 pounds of food from landfill in just one meal
 - o By composting plate waste, we reduced our landfill waste (trash) to less than 1 pound
 - If hotel policy allowed, we could have donated 42 pounds of food (the food prepared but never served) to people in need
