November 2017 Challenge: The College Search and Preparation Experience

**Quest:** Working as a team and using the provided persona, groups will identify three colleges that would be a good fit, describe why and outline one college application essay.

Due Date: November 30, 2017

**Activity Description:** This quest familiarizes students with the college search process and provides an opportunity to outline a college application essay.

## **Activity Objectives:**

- Identify one safety, one mid and one reach college or university.
- Describe why each one is a good fit.
- Complete the college application essay outline.

#### Time

> Two 45-60 minute sessions

#### **Procedures**

# <u>Day 1:</u>

- 1. Read the provided college applicant "persona" as a group. This is the persona you will use throughout the entire quest. (time 5 minutes)
- Review the <u>College Planning (Choosing A School: Navigating the Options)</u> (time roughly 15 minutes)
  - o This is a virtual course. If easier, split students into smaller groups.
- 3. Split the group into three smaller teams. Assign each team one category (safety, mid and reach) college. Each group should search (using various websites) and identify **one** college/university that fits their category and describe why (by answering the questions provided). (20- 30 minutes)
  - Hint: If you are looking for a place to start, check out the "Ideal College/University" list for your college applicant persona. Use these categories as a starting point to find a college for your applicant.
- 4. Bring group back together. Ask the following reflection questions (time 10 minutes)
  - Thinking about your own college search, what are/will be the most important factors to you as you consider your college choice?
  - O Do you have any "must haves" on your list?
  - If cost is a factor, what creative ways might you consider to help bring down those costs?

## Day 2:

- 1. Review the ASA College Application Essay Guide as a group (5 minutes)
- 2. Break up into small groups (same as day 1). As a small group, complete the college application essay question for your groups' identified college or university (40 minutes)
  - Hint: When writing your essay, check out the College application guide and sample college essay.
- 3. Bring group back together. Ask the following reflection questions (5 minutes)
  - o What did your group decide to write about and why?
  - O What was the most difficult part of writing this essay?
- 4. Have your captain (or another student volunteer) <u>upload your team's college essay and</u> school choice worksheet.
